Windermere Regatta

By now you will have received the material on the 1965 Canadian Championship Regatta at Windermere. As a large entry is expected, make your reservations early. Boats entered for the Regatta must have valid up-to-date Certificates, including 1965 Buoyancy Test and Measurement of New Sails and Black Bands on New Masts and/or Booms. Skippers should bring their Certificates to Windermere. If your Certificate is not yet completed, you should arrange with your Fleet Captain to complete Measurement. Boats which have been purchased second-hand need to have Certificate transferred to the new owner by sending the old Certificate to the Secretary-Treasurer. Processing of applications for Certificates will be expedited if mailed directly to Don Giffin, 1242 Albion Road, Rexdale, Ontario.

For those not staying at Windermere House, Saturday lunch and snacks will be available at the "Skipper" - the snack bar on the dock.

REMEMBER - Entries must be in to Bill Macintosh, 357 Bay Street, Toronto, by September 10, 1965.

Movies will be taken again at this year's Regatta. We would be very interested in any footage taken at other Regattas during the year, and would like all Clubs to keep this in mind next year. Good films of races are an excellent way to stimulate interest in the Albacore class in new areas.
