NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

Free Week-end: Clevelands House has very generously provided for a draw which will entitle a skipper and crew to a free week-end, so for one lucky pair the budget may balance after all.

Club Burgees: Last year a number of clubs presented their burgees to the Regatta Committee and these were displayed. We would like to have burgees of any clubs who have not already presented them.

Safety Equipment: The sailing instructions require that 'each boat competing shall carry a life preserver for each occupant, a pail, preferably tied to the boat, a sponge, a paddle and an adequate painter. All buoyancy shall be watertight and the buoyancy bags shall be fully inflated'.

CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP

When a boat is sold, the owner should notify Mrs. Barnes of the particulars of his new boat and the name and address of the person to whom he has sold the boat. If the boat has a measurement certificate it should be sent in and the new owner will be given a new certificate under his name. The boat does not require to be re-measured.

Willoughby Centennial Regatta

Geoffrey Revette of Niagara Sailing Club gave an indication of what was to come in the U.S. Championship when he ran away with the Willoughby Centennial Regatta by winning all four races. Sixteen boats competed in the best 3 of 4 race series which was shortened from a best 4 of 5 when lack of wind resulted in a cancellation of the first race Saturday morning. Two races were held Saturday afternoon in winds of 10-12 mph. Strong winds of 18-20 mph, gusting to 30 mph greeted the sailors Sunday morning with the result that seven boats either did not start or complete the race. After a brief rainstorm the wind settled down to a steady 15-18 mph for the last race Sunday afternoon. Results were as follows:
