There will be a meeting at the Boulevard Club, 1491 Lakeshore Blvd. West, Toronto, on Sunday, November 3rd at 2:00 p.m., of all Fleet Captains and Secretaries. This includes District Fleet Captains and Secretaries. Some clubs may not have appointed a Fleet Captain. In such an event will the Commodore please attend with the Secretary of the Club, or see that two suitable delegates attend. Matters of interest to all clubs will be discussed concerning the next season. Your suggestions will be welcome.

Canadian Championship Regatta, Sept. 13-15th

Bill Gooderham of the RCYC repeated his win of the 1966 season in winning Class A, emblematic of the Canadian Albacore Championship at Cleavelands House, Muskoka, September 13th to 15th. A record fleet of 154 boats completed in mainly light and shifty winds. The entry was divided into A Class 51 boats, B Class 60 boats and C Class 43 boats.

Don Giffen of Shadow Lake Sailing Club was second with a consistent performance of one win, a third and a fifth. Lloyd Feaver of Royal Hamilton Yacht Club who only sailed three races came up with excellent 9, 2, 2, finishes for an overall third. Fourth place overall went to the team of David Fell and Jane Patterson of the Muskoka Sailing Club's Junior Fleet who were very consistent with a 2, 5, 9 pattern to come well ahead most of their elders. Jack Progelhof of Wilson Yacht Club was the first U.S. boat in the overall listings. With a win and a fourth Jack was trying for a possible tie for first when he split tacks in the final windward leg. However the gamble did not work and he ended up with a twentieth dropping him to fifth overall.

In B Fleet the standout performance was by Al Price also of Wilson Yacht Club with two firsts and a fifth. (Al has been warned he'll never see B Fleet again. -Ed.) Second overall was Dave McFarlane of the Buffalo Canoe Club with a first, third and ninth. Tim Knight of Bronte Harbour, Angus Macmillan of Royal Hamilton Yacht Club and Ewing ("Mac") McGruer, of Owen Sound Sailing Club came third, fourth and fifth overall.

Spencer Dalton of Muskoka Lakes dominated C Class with two wins and a fifth followed closely by Gordon Wilson also of Muskoka Lakes with two seconds and an eighth. The rest of the C Class were spread between Marvin Downs, Royal Hamilton, third, John Macdonald of Lake of Bays, fourth and Norman Borzins of Niagara Yacht Club fifth.

The over-all winners represented in the top ten of each class came from thirteen different clubs showing the development of racing across the class. The most outstanding perhaps was the Wilson Yacht Club who placed two winners in the top ten in Class A, the winner of Class B and tenth overall in Class C out of a total entry of four.

The first race Friday afternoon started with good winds and a major wind shift at the start so that starboard tack boats could hardly lay the starting line making the port end heavily favoured. Bill Gooderham, 277, got a clear start and never lost his lead to win the race. Other leaders were Bud Purvis, 547, and Peter Schell, 2312. Purvis led throughout the race until the last downwind leg in planing winds. Purvis went high on this leg and Schell went low to nose out Purvis by a few inches at the finish line to come second with Purvis third. Close behind were Jack Langmaid, 618, Michael Johnson, 2505, and Peter McLaughlin, 1805.

The second race Saturday morning started in virtually no wind and had to be called off when the first leg had not been completed at nearly twelve o'clock. Light wind continued late on Saturday afternoon the third race started. This time a shift before the start favoured the windward end. Dave Humphrey, 3103, led around the windward mark with the Fell-Patterson team, 1811, and Bill Gooderham following. Giffen, 652, then passed Gooderham and Fell-Patterson to windward but Gooderham then took the lead again which he held till the finish. Humphrey luffed Giffen letting Fell-Patterson slip ahead to finish second, Progelhof, 2358, gained on both Giffen and Humphrey finishing fourth with Humphrey third and Giffen fifth. There wasn't time for a second race Saturday afternoon.

The wind was light again for the first race Sunday morning but there was a good line and the wind was steadier. Lloyd Feaver, 2062, had a good lead at the first mark but Jack Progelhof passed him on the second leg. Feaver then repassed Giffen who had run out of wind and held second to the finish. Giffen took third and Andy Jones, 2355, who was just behind the leaders took fourth by coming up from below on the final leg with Gooderham finishing fifth.

The fifth race was started immediately after with the wind freshening somewhat but still light. John Anderson, 2700, took the lead on the first windward leg with Lloyd Feaver and Giffen rounding second and third. By the third leg Giffen had taken the lead from Anderson and after the leeward mark tried to cover Anderson on port tack while Feaver, Revett and Progelhof the following boats went on starboard tack and ran out of wind. Giffen stayed between Feaver and the finish line and came first with Feaver following and then Anderson, Gooderham and Fell-Patterson.

Despite generally light winds it was a good series. The official starter Bud Roulstone did a fine job in starting the fleets under somewhat difficult conditions. The full results are as follows:
