At a recent meeting of the Canadian Albacore Association Executive, a motion was passed whereby Shackles & Cringles was to become once again an Association publication exclusively, compiled and printed by us. This is in contrast to the arrangement which we have had during the last year whereby each month one or two pages of Better Boating Magazine have been allocated to us.

The Committee decision came after considerable comparison had been made between the old system of publication (to which we are reverting) and the one we have experimented with during the past year. A considerable section of the membership felt that somehow Shackles & Cringles lost its personal flavour through being a small part of a large non-sailing oriented magazine.

The change in form of Shackles & Cringles will coincide with a change in editor although I must hasten to add that the two changes are totally unrelated. I unfortunately have to resign because I expect to be away from Toronto for a year or so. At the time of going to press, we are not quite sure of the name of the new editor, but you may watch for his name at the head of the next issue of Shackles & Cringles.

### WORLD AND NORTH AMERICAN ALBACORE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Regatta Committee has met frequently in recent weeks and it looks as though we should have a really first-class regatta at the Royal Canadian Yacht Club. With approximately 15 Britons, 25 Americans, and the balance of the 100 boats being Canadian, we will be treated to a most exciting and impressive spectacle.

Invitations to selected applicants have already been sent out, and the programme of events determined. His Excellency, the Governor General of Canada, will give a trophy for the winner of the World Albacore Championship and he will attend the first race of the week's programme.

### REGATTA NOTICES

The Stormont Yacht Club is holding its annual Upper Canada Open Regatta on June 12-13th. It is hoped to make this as major an event on the Albacore calendar as it is for the GP-14. While open to all Albacores, the Upper Canada is the first of the season to count towards the Area 10 Travelleir Trophy and Area 10 Standing. Other classes invited include GP-14, OK and Cadet. Further information concerning registration, measurement, starting time etc. will be available shortly from the Secretary, Stormont Yacht Club, Box 1321, Cornwall.

For your information, Stormont is a small but active club with 8 Albacores, 18 GP-14's, 8 Cadets and various other boats. It is hoped to increase the Albacore fleet to 12-14 this year. The Upper Canada Regatta should be a good preparation for the North American and World Championship the following week as in excess of 25 Albacores are expected. Stormont is well qualified as it organized the first GP-14 World Championship in 1967. Fifty-one boats with crews from as far as Australia, South Africa and Wales attended.

The Stormont Yacht Club Secretary would be pleased to hear from those planning to attend and answer queries.

The Fanshawe Yacht Club of London, Ontario cordially invites you to the 8th Annual "June Bug" regatta. TORONTO DISTRICT - NO. 4

For those sailors registering for L.S.S.A. and M.V.R.C. events, for the 1971 season, two Albacore starts will be provided in each regatta. Accordingly, your Toronto district executive is dividing the Toronto area sailors into A and B fleets for the purpose of having an approximate equal number of boats in each start. All district A sailors are being advised individually of A fleet designation.

Selection of A fleet is based on previous years' results in regattas in Toronto and elsewhere. It should be understood that A designation for the Toronto area races does not infer A rating in the Canadian Albacore Association.

Accordingly, sailors designated A fleet in the Toronto area, and sailors from other areas entering Toronto L.S.S.A. or M.V.R.C. regattas, should do the following:-

1. Designate A fleet on the M.V.R.C. entry form.

2. Display a 6" x 8" yellow leech pennant, attached to the leech of the main sail with the top edge of the pennant opposite the bottom edge of the upper batten pocket. The 6" inch width is to be fixed to the leech.

Your Toronto district executive may review the situation after one or two M.V.R.C. races and adjust the A designations where deemed advisable.
