

Invitation:

The Nepean Sailing Club (NSC) and the Canadian Albacore Association invite you to attend the 2001 Canadian Albacore Championship Regatta to be held Friday through Sunday, September 14-16, 2001.

Site:

The 2001 Canadian Albacore Championship Regatta will be held on Lac Deschenes and hosted by the Nepean Sailing Club.

Eligibility:

The 2001 Canadian Albacore Championship Regatta is open to Albacore class sailors who meet all class membership and yacht measurement requirements and who have paid all event fees before beginning official competition (see Registration and Fees below). All entrants must be members in good standing of the CAA and/or USAA. There will be an A fleet and a B fleet. The Helms who have won the B fleet trophy are not eligible to helm in the B fleet. The B fleet is aimed towards sailors who are competing at the national level for the first time.

Rules:

The 2001 Canadian Albacore Championship Regatta will be governed by the 2001-2004 Racing Rules of Sailing including changes issued by the ISAF, the prescriptions of the Canadian Yachting Association (CYA), and the rules of the Canadian Albacore Association, except where altered by this notice or the Regatta Sailing Instructions. In the event of conflict, the Regatta Sailing Instructions will take precedence.

Scoring:

The low point scoring system will apply. The completion of one (1) race constitutes a series. One throw-out will be allowed providing at least five (5) races are completed. The intent is to complete at least seven (7) races.

Measurement:

All boats must be accompanied with a valid measurement certificate and a current buoyancy endorsement. All boats must comply with CAA measurement specifications for this event. No provisions will be made for issuing new measurement certificates or buoyancy endorsements at this regatta.

Registration and

Fees:

Registration forms can be printed and mailed to Van Sheppard, 509-215 Parkdale Avenue, Ottawa, ON K1Y 4T8. The entry fee is \$150.00 Canadian per boat for entries postmarked or received after 15 August 2001. Please make cheques payable to: Area 10 Albacore Association. The entry fee includes all racing, regatta awards, pizza party and Saturday dinner.

Advance Registration: Sailors may register in advance and receive a discount by sending the registration form and fee to Van Sheppard, 509-215 Parkdale Avenue, Ottawa, ON K1Y 4T8. Advance registration fee is \$130.00 Canadian for those entries postmarked or received on or before 15 August 2001.

A Plug for the Canadian Albacore Championships in Ottawa By Van Sheppard

Spring is here! I can tell when it "officially" arrives because I start sanding something on my boat, and I did that two weeks ago. If all goes well I should be able to sail at least once before going to Mid-Atlantics in New Jersey, which is where we start our racing season.

I plan to get out and sail a lot this year including several away regattas, as we are hosting the Canadian Championships here in September and I am hoping to take advantage of some local knowledge to get a best ever result (probably not too hard to do given my showings to date). I also want to push the Canadians and encourage as many sailors as possible to attend. In fact that's the reason I'm writing this short article. I want to shamelessly plug our city, club, fleet, beer... whatever it takes to convince, persuade, cajole, shame, blackmail, or guilt you into coming to visit in September.

Our City is beautiful, clean and best of all contains a large lake with our sailing club on it. Think that sounds to farfetched to be true... come and check it out. If I'm wrong I'll buy the beer. Heck, there may be a keg or two around even if I'm right! September is also a great month to visit and sail in, the water is still warm and there is usually good wind, although maybe not up to Meaford standards.

Our club is a great place to sail. Lots of space for your boats, trailers and dollies. We have 3 ramps and enough dock space to get the whole fleet on the water in very short order. If you're the outdoorsy type, camping is
